



*A beautiful woodland buffer and nature trail separate Winmore from the hustle and bustle of homes and the work-a-day world.*



*A few steps from your door is a changing pageant of colorful wildflowers which begin blooming in early March and continue through November. The woodlands also contain an incomparable variety of trees including elegant silver beeches, tulip magnolias, sycamores, redbuds which dash the hillsides with pastel pink in early spring, maples with vibrant red winglets in spring and dazzling scarlet in fall, and a medley of oak and hickory trees which provide both color and*



*food for woodland critters. The Piedmont of North Carolina offers a temperate climate for an early morning or evening stroll year-round, as well as an endless source of natural treasures.*

*The Winmore Nature Trails contain a surprising variety of terrain from the high rocky cliff on the western side to the flat grassy expanse on the eastern side. Moreover, the trails are seldom far from Bolin Creek - which makes a U-turn around the playing field - or the tributary creek to the West. There is a picnic table on a small bluff overlooking the creek near the open field.*
